# THREE BC GRADUATION QUALIFICATIONS

- Dogwood Diploma- Awarded to students who successfully complete the provincial graduation requirements.
- Adult Dogwood- Awarded to students over the age of 18 who take courses as credit towards their adult graduation diploma.
- Evergreen Certificate- Represents a completion of personal learning goals as identified in the student's Individual Education Plan (IEP).

Each course may be delivered as two 2-credit courses or one 4-credit course, depending on the school.

# **DOGWOOD DIPLOMA ARTS EDUCATION/ADST REQUIREMENTS**

- Choose 4 credits in Grade 10, 11 or 12 in Arts Education and/or Applied Design Skills and Technologies.
- Examples could include: Dance, Drama, Music and Visual Arts, Food Studies, Culinary Arts, Textiles.

# **DOGWOOD DIPLOMA ELECTIVE REQUIREMENTS**

## Minimum of 28 credits required.

Depending on the school's offerings and student's choice, the number of electives in each grade level will vary.

The 28 elective credits in Grade 10–12 can come from the following options:

- Ministry-developed or ministry-approved courses
- External Credentials

# **EXTERNAL CREDITS**

- External credits can be awarded with proper documentation for a number of possible courses.
- Examples of these could include: Cadets, Royal Conservatory Music, Young Drivers, Girl Guides.

# PLEASE NOTE

### **Total: 80 Credits required for Graduation**

\*Of the 80 credits needed for graduation, at least 16 credits must be at the Grade 12 level, including a Grade 12 Language Arts course.

# **EXAMINATIONS AND ASSESSMENTS**

Examinations/	Requirement:
Assessments	□ Graduation Literacy Assessment (any time in Grades 10, 11, 12; two rewrites possible)
	□ Graduation Numeracy Assessment (any time in Grades 10, 11, 12; two rewrites possible)

- New graduation Numeracy and Literacy assessments are now evaluated with a four point provincial proficiency scale (no pass or fail score).
- Can be taken at any time between Grades 10-12.
- Are a stand-alone assessment (not tied to a course).
- Results will appear on student's transcripts and student's best outcome will be recorded on final transcript.

# **EXAMINATIONS AND ASSESSMENTS**

- Numeracy assessment is currently in place and active.
- Literacy assessment will start in 2019/20 school year.
- Current English 12 and Communications 12 students are still required to write the provincial exam until the end of this school year.

# ADULT DOGWOOD REQUIREMENTS

- To be eligible, a student must be 18 years or older.
- Three courses must be completed after the age of 18.
- Adult learners are not required to complete the Graduation Numeracy or Literacy assessments.
- All Ministry Authorized Work Experience 12 or Youth Work in Trades 12 courses can be applied to the Adult Dogwood.

# **EVERGREEN CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS**

- The Evergreen certificate does not represent graduation and therefore is not equivalent to a Dogwood or Adult Dogwood.
- It represents the completion of personal learning goals as identified in the student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP).
- It is intended to celebrate success in learning and accomplishments of diverse learners.
- To be eligible, the student must have an IEP and be designated in one of the Ministry of Education's inclusive education categories.

# **ADAPTATIONS**

- Adaptations can be made to credit courses to accommodate student's diverse learning needs as detailed in their IEP.
- Examples of adaptations could include adapting the length of assignments or giving additional time for exams.
- For each credit course, students must be able to demonstrate their learning and that they have met the prescribed learning outcomes and skills.
- Credit course work cannot be adapted excessively in order to protect the integrity of the course.
- A credit course adapted excessively then becomes a modified course and the student will not receive credit.
- Depending on the level of course load reduction, this will be reflected in the student's grade to the teacher's discretion.

# **COURSE SELECTION PROCESS**

- Meeting with SE grad student, family, Caseload manager, and Nicole Filipski, SE grad coordinator <u>nfilipski@ascendonline.ca</u>
- Grad planning discussion will consist of graduation track options, and course selection for each term.
- Caseload manager to fill out online SE Grad Course Selection form.
- SE grad coordinator to review form and give authorization for course enrolment.
- Student/family enrol in courses using SSDAS login.
- Courses approved in SSDAS by SE grad coordinator (based on previous discussions).
- Note: Additional or reduced course requests that were not discussed at the initial meeting, must be approved by SE grad coordinator.
- Once approved, courses will be available for student access the next day in Moodle.
